The evening ended with the story of Robert Lewis Stevenson as a young child in Edinburgh: "As dusk was turning to darkness, Robert had his face pinned to the window at the front of his house, fascinated by the lamplighter coming down the street with his ladder and burning wick, lighting the old-fashioned gas street lamps and setting them ablaze for the night. His parents asked him, 'Robert, what in the world are you looking at out there?' With great excitement he exclaimed, 'Look at that man! He's punching holes in the darkness!'"

My prayer is that God would use our church for generations to come to be a beacon of light in the midst of the darkness. God is calling all of us to be lamplighters in His story, punching holes into our dark world. As we approach the 2021 year-end, would you consider partnering with us financially? We must dare to dream again, to believe that God will do something great at a key moment in the life of our church, our city, and our world.




