This chronological reading plan provides a schedule for daily time in God's Word and is the perfect foundation for our Fall Women's Bible Study.

MATTHEW | MARK | LUKE | JOHN

Before you begin, it is helpful to know this genre of scripture is referred to as the gospels. These gospel narratives are a type of ancient biography on Jesus' life, ministry, death, resurrection and ascension. What can sometimes be confusing is we also use the word "gospel" to talk about the good news of God's love for sinners found in the person and work of Jesus Christ. Through Jesus' active obedience, sinners are made right with God and declared righteous. Jesus, the perfect son of God, came into the world, took on flesh, lived a perfect life, died, rose from the grave, and ascended into heaven to offer sinners a relationship with the Father forever.

In your reading, you will witness people who behold Jesus with affection as their personal Lord and Savior. Others will reject Jesus and be blinded to His glory.

Come as you are to spend time with your Creator. Ask the Holy Spirit to increase your hunger for His Word and watch Him transform your mind and heart with wisdom, knowledge and understanding as you grow in righteousness.

"Father, as I open your Word, would you open my mind and heart to see Jesus so that I may love you more and be made more like Him today."

QUESTIONS TO GUIDE YOUR READING

GOD AND MAN Jesus was both God and man. How does today's reading demonstrate Christ's humanity and/or divinity? What does this passage tell you about Jesus? (His power, priorities, and responses)

NAME What names are used to describe Jesus in this passage? (Son of man, Bread of Life, Teacher, etc.)

CHARACTER Jesus is the visible expression of the invisible God (Colossians 1:15). In today's reading, where do you see God's character expressed in the person of Jesus?

CLUES Many Old Testament people, places, practices and prophecies foreshadowed the person and work of Jesus Christ. In your reading today, do you see any allusions to the Old Testament revealing that Jesus is the promised Redeemer?

PARABLES Parables are stories Jesus used to explain his kingdom. The parables contain puzzles with a hidden truth.
Mark 4:11 - *"Jesus told them, 'The secret of the kingdom of God has been given to you. But to those on the outside everything is said in parables.'"*
A helpful question while reading parables is "What does this parable reveal about how God works in His kingdom?" Where do you see signs of his working in your life today?

MIRACLES Miracles revealed Christ's divinity and kingship. How does this miracle show Christ's power and control over the natural order? What difference did this miracle make in the lives of the people it touched? Where do you need His power and control in your life today?

OTHERS MENTIONED Who are the individuals mentioned in this passage and how do they interact with Him (i.e., desperate for help, antagonistic, doubting, complete faith? Note if they are Jew or Gentile.)
