DAY 1 "JOY HAS DAWNED"

—The story behind the carol

*"I will sing to the Lord all my life;
I will sing praise to my God as long as I live."*

PSALM 104:33

Keith and our friend Stuart Townend wrote this carol while Keith and I were living in Switzerland. From where we lived you can often see snow on the top of Mont Blanc, the tallest mountain of the Alps, all year round! They wanted to write a Christmas Carol that told the story of Jesus' birth and what it means for us. Stuart has three children and we have four. They both love to tell stories to their kids especially ones about the Lord. One of the ways they do that is to put the stories into songs. They spent a long time going over every word and note, trying to make them clear and beautiful. We have sung it every Christmas since they finished it!

Singing is a great way to remember something. We often travel as a family on the road when we are performing concerts. Sometimes that means doing home school on the tour bus or backstage at a concert hall. One October our daughter Charlotte was writing the date out on a white board. Before she started to write it, she suddenly sang a little song that spelled out the word "October". She had learned the song at school and it helped her remember the letters in the right order!

How kind of the Lord to make us in such a way that when we sing something, we can remember it better. How wonderful when those songs are about Him!



JOHN 1:1, 4 & 5

Do you find it hard to sleep on Christmas Eve? It's dark and you just can't wait for the morning! I still find it hard to sleep on Christmas Eve because I'm so excited!


Before the very first day there ever was it was dark. The earth had not been made yet. Then God said, "let there be light" and there was! And it was sparkling without a smudge. The earth was completely safe and there was nothing to fear.

DAY 3 **Not with fanfares from above, not with scenes of glory But a humble gift of love, Jesus born of Mary**

"Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls."

MATTHEW 11:29

A 'fanfare' is a loud and lively piece of music played by brass instruments like a trumpet. It is often used to introduce someone important—like a President or King and Queen.

When a royal baby is born it is usually a very big deal for everyone. I remember when the new princes and princess of England were born. There were hundreds of cameras clicking outside the hospital trying to snatch the first photograph! They were born with the best doctors. They moved into the palace. They were dressed in the best clothes you could buy. The news went all over the world in seconds!

Yet when the greatest King was born, He came much more humbly, much more gently. Jesus, who made the silver light of stars, the golden rays of the sun, the ruby color of an evening sky was born as a little baby in an animal's stable and laid in a manger. No great palace. No huge crowd squeezing in. No fanfare.

To be humble is something that pleases God's heart. What does it mean to be humble? It is much more than the things we have or don't have. In the Bible it really means to trust and rely on the Lord and then to love and follow Him completely. This means to care much more about His importance than my own. This means to love the Lord and others more than I love myself. Christ shows us that this is what it looks like to be truly great. He came as a humble gift of love to everyone.

LUKE 2:6-7




We have had four babies and each one so incredibly special. When they were born, I counted each of their fingers! I couldn't believe how tiny they were as they wrapped round my little finger. I also felt a little scared thinking how much they needed me. They were so helpless! Imagine how Mary felt looking at her little baby. How could God have made Himself so small? His hands had spread out the skies like a huge blanket. Now He was holding on tight to His mother and was wrapped in a blanket. Who could ever have imagined such a story? Only God could.

He came just like us to save us. Every person is so precious to the Lord. Every baby growing inside their mother's tummy right up to the oldest grandma or grandpa who feels weak like a little child again. The God of the stars sees the twinkle in your eye. Shepherds bow before the Lamb gazing at the glory
Gifts of men from distant lands prophecy the story

The poetry in this first line might sound a bit strange to you—why would Jesus be called a Lamb? Jesus has many different names. Each of these names tell us something about who He is. He is Savior because He saves us. He is a King because He rules over the whole world. He is a Lamb because in the times before Jesus was born lambs were given to pay for the forgiveness of the sins of the people. When Jesus died on the cross, He was like the Lamb paying for our sins. In the Christmas story the Shepherds who took care of sheep and their lambs day and night were now worshipping Jesus, the Lamb. It was marvelous for them to see this!

Jesus had other visitors when He was little. They were very different to the Shepherds. They were from far away. They were very clever and wealthy. They hadn't heard of Jesus as a Lamb. They had seen a star in the sky which they knew as a sign that a King had been born. God brought people who were close by and far away. People who had very little and knew very little and people who had a lot and knew a lot. All needed to come and see Jesus. It is the same today. Wherever we are from, whatever we have we come and worship Him.

"On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh."

MATTHEW 2:11

We all love receiving gifts, don't we? Often those gifts can tell you a little about what we are like and what we do. I remember one Christmas when I was 10 or 11 I got a little music playing machine with a microphone attached to it because I loved to sing. Think of a gift you have received and what it might tell someone about you.

The special gifts the wise men brought tell us something more about Jesus. The gift of gold is a wonderful way to tell us that Jesus is the King. Kings wear golden crowns and sit on golden thrones. Incense (Frankincense) is like a perfume. Just like the smell of a beautiful perfume might fill a room it reminds us that the Lord Jesus came to be with us, to live with us. We can come to Him who helps us. Myrrh is a special ointment that was used to put on a person's body when they had died. This reminds us that Jesus came that He might die on the cross to take away our sins.

The main reason we give and receive gifts at Christmas is to remind one another of the greatest gift we all can receive—the love and grace of Jesus.

JOHN 3:16


In the Narnia stories the Pevensie children are often called the Sons of Adam and Daughters of Eve. This is because back in the very beginning God created the first man and woman, Adam and Eve. Everyone on earth has come from them—their great great great great great great... grandchildren! You are a son of Adam or a daughter of Eve. You have a body, and a brain, and dreams, and a heart, and a soul like them. But we also have sin like them too.

After Eve disobeyed God in the garden of Eden He gave her a promise. He said that one day someone would be born who would be able to take all the sin and pain away. A Son of Adam would come; Jesus, the Son of God. Unlike us He would have no sin. So He was able to reconcile us—make it possible for us to be friends with God again.

We like stories about champions, heroes who saved the day. What is your favorite champion story? The Bible has many stories of champions—Moses rescuing the children of Israel, King David leading many battles, Queen Esther saving her people, Daniel in the lion's den. But none of them could save people forever. No one could rescue a person's heart from the sin inside it. Only Jesus could do what we needed most—He is the greatest Champion!

Eric Liddle, a man from Scotland, won a gold medal at the Olympics many years ago. He was a hero and very famous but He loved the Lord more than everything else. He left Scotland to go to China so that he could tell people there about Jesus' love for them. The day he left from Waverly train station in Edinburgh there were many people who came to say goodbye. He was asked if he would like to speak to everyone. Instead he sang the hymn 'Jesus shall reign' which has the words 'His Kingdom stretch from shore to shore'. He knew that Jesus was the Lord of all the earth through all of time and people needed to hear this.

We may see the Lord Jesus as a baby at Christmas time but always remember that this same baby is the 'Lord of all of history.' Nobody is above Him or beyond Him. He holds the skies and all that happens beneath them. It is right and fitting that we should praise Him—when we love someone we want to say we do! And when we do others will hear about Him too.




LUKE 2:6

When a baby is born the first thing you want to hear is their cry! It's the big sign that their little bodies are breathing in the air for the first time. After this I remember the doctor resting my babies on my chest so they could hear my heart beat. It brought them comfort. They knew the sound of my heart beat very well after growing so many months inside of me. At all the check ups the doctors would let me hear my slower heartbeat and their faster heartbeat. PSALM 16:11





'Joy to the World' is celebrating its 300th birthday! An English man called Isaac Watts wrote it. The lyrics were inspired by Psalm 98—that's where are Bible reading is from above.

It wasn't meant to be a Christmas Carol but the words remind us of all that Christmas means for us. The King has come and He is the Savior of the world and will set everything right. We welcome Him with worship, with singing and with lives that follow Him. Its melody and poetry are bursting with energy and joy. Just like the bright green leaves burst out of the trees after a long winter Jesus brings new life to us. He came once before and will come again. When He does all will be made right!






What other ways can we 'prepare Him room' not just for Christmas but every day?





"...the whole crowd of disciples began joyfully to praise God in loud voices... "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!...Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to Jesus, "Teacher, rebuke your disciples!" "I tell you," he replied, "if they keep quiet, the stones will cry out."

LUKE 19:37-40

All the things that God has made show and tell His great power. The sky that reaches further than anyone can see. The song the crickets make when they rub their little wings together. The great splashing sound of a waterfall rushing down a mountain side.

Luke 19 tells us about a time when Jesus' disciples were shouting out praises to Him. There were some who were angry as they didn't believe He was the Son of God. They tried to stop it! But Jesus said 'If they keep quiet the stones will cry out!'

GENESIS 3:17-18

Our home in Northern Ireland has a big field out the back and our daughters like to hunt for wild flowers. They can sometimes be hard to get to because so many thistles and thorns grow up beside them. No matter how often they are pulled out those weeds keep coming back!




