Biblical Prophets and Prophecy

A biblical prophet was divinely chosen and inspired by God to proclaim his message to the people. While the prophetic messages were originally delivered to address a particular historical situation, many prophecies pointed beyond the original historical setting and addressed the future. This is especially true with respect to the book of Isaiah.

As you read through chapters 1-39, you will find that some of the prophecies in these chapters were fulfilled at one level during Isaiah's lifetime, yet many of these prophecies would find their ultimate fulfillment in the future. The technical term for this is double fulfillment of prophecy.

Additionally, we encourage you to read the introduction to Isaiah in your study Bible. If you don't already have a study Bible, we recommend either the Zondervan NASB Study Bible or the ESV Gospel Transformation Study Bible.

Beloved, we are about to embark on an exciting journey in our exploration of the book of Isaiah. May God illuminate our understanding through the Holy Spirit as we continue to plumb the depths of the unsearchable riches of Christ that are found in his Word.
