Letter from Pastor Rob

Dear Church Family,

Every day I spend as your pastor, I am reminded how much God is doing through our church and how privileged I am to serve alongside you. I was struck by a common theme I heard in the testimonies of several of our new members who shared that finding Coral Ridge was like coming home. In Galatians, Paul writes of belonging to a household of faith. One component of belonging to that household of faith is the call to not grow weary in our mission.

We are surrounded by people in desperate need of hope and answers. Our culture continues to decline around us as people run after things that will never satisfy. As a church, we are committed to stand as a beacon of hope in an upside-down world. We have the only answer that a lost and longing generation truly needs.

As I mentioned in a recent sermon, the fate of many churches after bowing to the changing tides of cultural demands is to, quite simply, not exist. Coral Ridge is committed to not compromise the message of the Gospel or soften the truth found in scripture. Truth without love is compromise, but love without truth is condemnation. We will continue to boldly proclaim God's love and the truth of the Gospel to a lost and dying world.

In direct contrast to the image of a dying world, we are experiencing at Coral Ridge a time of great growth and new life. At this year's Kingdom Come Conference, a dear friend of our church, Dr. Albert Mohler, talked about how Coral Ridge is uniquely poised to impact our culture for the sake of God's Kingdom. He commented that one sign of a healthy church is the need for more nursery workers on Sunday mornings. If you have been



attending services with us consistently, you will have experienced first-hand the joy of welcoming new covenant children into our church family through baptism. As we continue to raise the next generation on the foundational truths of scripture, we look forward with great expectation to what God will do through our church in the coming months and years.








Lifelong Impact | Dominique deBenckendorff

"The impact Coral Ridge has had on my life started many, many years ago. As a young 20-year-old with two daughters, I knew nothing about raising children or even about Jesus. I was scanning the radio for Christian programming and found a man with a very distinct voice, Dr. Kennedy, who I listened to regularly before discovering his television program. I fell in love with the whole service: the organ, the choir, and Dr. Kennedy's teaching. I started reading my Bible from cover to cover, teaching Sunday School, professing my faith to others, and 'bringing up my children in the way they should go.' Dr. Kennedy helped me raise my children and live as a faithful Christian with character and integrity.

Many years later, after an abusive divorce, another broken relationship brought me to South Florida. I ended up completely alone and in the darkest period of my life. I pleaded with God to save me from the abusive situation and help me find refuge. In 2022, I was scanning the radio while driving and heard a radio host discussing Dr. Kennedy. As I listened, the host mentioned Coral Ridge Presbyterian Church in Fort Lauderdale. At that very moment, I was passing by the church on Federal Highway and knew that it was a sign I needed to visit the church. When I walked in that next Sunday, I was overwhelmed to tears being in the place that I had seen on TV for so many years, and which had made such an impact on my faith and life.

Over the next few weeks, Pastor Rob spoke regularly about the Generation to Generation capital campaign and invited everyone to attend the wall breaking ceremony. I knew I had to be there. My faith was developed in this church and my children were raised remotely from this church and Dr. Kennedy's ministry. When we were given the opportunity to write something on the foundational walls of the Kennedy Fellowship Hall, I wrote the following: 'Train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old he will not depart from it' Proverbs 22:6. This church has been an integral part of my healing from abuse and brought me back to my faith and knowing that God has been there with me the whole time. Coral Ridge has truly changed my life in a 'full circle' way from generation to generation. I now sing in the choir, am becoming a member, and can only hope and pray that one day my daughters and grandchildren will join me here."
