At the onset of his earthly ministry, Jesus chose twelve particular men for apostolic ministry. An apostle is one sent with a message. The apostolic ministry to which the original twelve were called was to continue Jesus' ministry by witnessing to the significance of his person and work, beginning in Jerusalem and extending to the ends of the earth (Acts 1:8). While Paul was not one of the original twelve, he was no less called to be an apostle by Jesus himself (Acts 9:15-16). Paul's unique apostolic mission was to take the gospel into the Gentile world.

Twenty-seven books comprise the divinely inspired New Testament scriptures, and thirteen of those were authored by Paul. As you read through the book of Acts (authored by Luke) in addition to several of Paul's writings this summer, we invite you also to read the introductions to these scriptures in your study Bible. If you do not have a study Bible, we recommend either the Zondervan NASB Study Bible or the ESV Gospel Transformation Study Bible. We invite you also to pray for one another and for the further expansion of the gospel as we anticipate being united together again in our study time this fall.
